

Your wedding day is a very special occasion and you might be planning to capture some precious moments on film, video tape or DVD. If you include music, whether live, pre-recorded or added during the editing process, then you probably need a Wedding Video-Recording Licence.

This is because the music you are recording may be protected by copyright and the law requires that permission is obtained in advance from the copyright owners and that the appropriate fees are paid.

If your wedding video includes any of the following then a licence is required:

Music from pre-recorded formats

- + Music from a commercial CD/tape etc. (whilst filming or added afterwards)
- + A disco at the reception

Live Music Recording (congregation, worship or live band)

- + Hymns and worship songs sung during the service
- + Music/songs performed live during the signing of the register
- + A live band at the reception

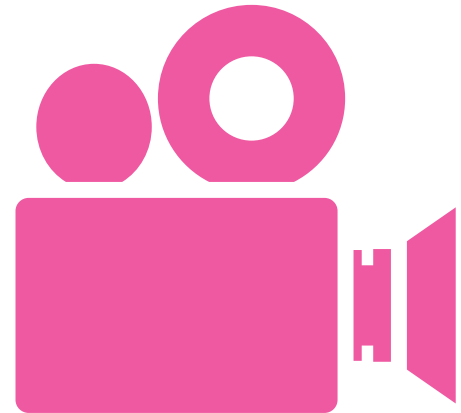
